

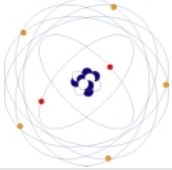

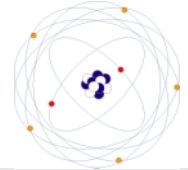

## Monday, February 3rd Steven's Steak House



### “Practical Paint Making” George Goodwin - *Elementis Specialties*

This presentation is designed to bring you closer to optimum high speed disperser performance in your plant. The theory of high speed dispersion is reviewed and linked to a number of practical ideas for optimizing high speed dispersion. Key topics include proper blade selection and maintenance, optimizing operating technique, and optimizing the mill base for faster throughput rates and improved fineness-of-grind. The objectives are to allow you to significantly reduce high speed dispersion time (to less than 15 minutes), improve pigment(s) dispersion, and minimize rework.

Even if you are an “old hand” at making paint, come to this meeting to review the basics and learn about new research on high speed dispersion. Bring your production people along to learn how to optimize high speed disperser performance.

The ideas presented have been gathered from many chemists, engineers, and production people in the paint industry across the country. You won't want to miss this wealth of “common sense” ideas to improve high speed dispersion in your plant right away.

George Goodwin has been a Technical Manager for Elementis for the past 29 years. He has 40 years of diversified experience in the coatings industry.

## MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Dear Members:

Due to a number of factors the FSCT has decided to raise their portion of the dues \$20 for this coming year and another \$20 for the following year.

The Federation, FSCT, will still go to a direct billing for membership renewals. The amount of those dues for this upcoming invoice will be \$90; up from \$65 last year. It is important to know that the \$90 bill consists of \$60 for the FSCT and \$30 for CSCT. Last year the breakdown was \$40 for FSCT and \$25 for CSCT. The 2004 invoice amount will be \$110.

The CSCT board felt it is important to offer our members another option. We will offer another level of membership, which we have called CSCT Local. The annual dues for the CSCT Local membership will be \$30 for Full Members and \$15 for Retired and Students.

**You will have to make a decision as to which membership option to choose.**

CSCT Local members will get our monthly newsletter, be able to attend all monthly technical meetings, any annually run technical symposiums put on by the CSCT, our Awards Banquet, our Annual Golf Outing, and any other CSCT sponsored event. He/She will be fully qualified to hold offices on the Executive Board or on any Committee. You will not receive any of the FSCT benefits.

FSCT members will receive all of the benefits currently available to the CSCT Local member plus the FSCT member benefits listed.

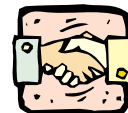

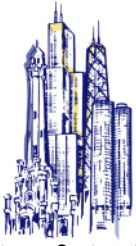

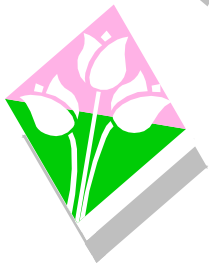
