# Warren C. Ashley

Past President of CSCT 1954-1955 Date of Birth: December 25th, 1904 Entered Into Rest: March 29th, 2004



From 1961:

Warren C. Ashley, a native of Yorkville, Illinois, received his early education under the tutorship of his father and the local country grade school. He attended Yorkville Consolidated High School, taking part in sports as tackle on the football team and graduated with the honor of being Valedictorian. Passing up scholarships, he chose to attend the University of Illinois, where "Red" Grange was playing football, and graduated with honors from the college of Education in 1929.

Warren attained his Master of Science degree from the University of Illinois in 1930 and accepted a Research Fellowship at Iowa State College under Henry Gilman in 1931 working on Furfural, a chemical obtained from corn cobs. Turning down a Teaching Fellowship at Iowa State, he returned to the University of Illinois to work under Ralph Shriner and received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in organic chemistry with minors in physical chemistry and physics. It was during the latter period that he had his first experience with plastics while doing part time work for F. C. Huyck and Sons on methods to prevent felting of wool. While at the University he made various organic compounds including orthophenanthrolene, a new indicator for iron, and a series of compounds to test the theory of hydrogen bonding.

During the summer of 1934, Warren worked for the Eastman Kodak Company in their synthetic chemical department and in 1935 began work at the Battelle Memorial Institute, Columbus, Ohio, where he remained until 1938. At the Institute he set up the organic Chemical Department, specializing in plastics and produced a foamed urea resin, perhaps the first of the light weight foamed plastics.

In 1938 Warren came to his present employer, Pyroxylin Products Inc., as a chemist. Here he has spent fruitful years of research and development including work on formulation of heat seal and non-heat seal moisture vaporproof lacquers for paper and formulas for strippable lacquers developed during World War II. At present he represents Pyroxylin Products Inc. as a Technical salesman.

The Chicago Society for Paint Technology has been served well by Warren over many years as a member and an outstanding officer, as shown by his enviable record of achievements. Over the years he has been chairman of the following Society Committee: Membership, technical for two years, Standards and Methods of Test (three years), Publicity, Program, Outstanding Service Award, Nominating, Yearbook, Executive and Golf Outing. His Technical Committee won first prize with the research paper "Comparison of Recently Developed Plasticizers for Nitro-Cellulose" at the war time Federation Annual Meeting in Chicago in 1945. Warren also won the George B. Heckel Award for the best presentation of this paper. The second part of the paper was presented by his committee at the Atlantic City convention in 1946.

Warren held all elective offices of the Chicago Society, being President, 1954-1955 and for the past three years has been the alternate Federation Council Representative. During his tour as officer of the Society, Warren has inaugurated or has been instrumental in the adoption of many innovations that have added to the prestige and betterment of the Society. Time will not permit listing all these, but to point out a few, ...




